



The Pastor's Reflection

"I am troubled now. Yet what should I say? 'Father, save me from this hour'? But it was for this purpose that I came this hour." (Jn 12:27) to

Dear brothers and sisters

The Greeks, gentiles who converted to Judaism, want to see Jesus (cf. Jn 12:20). On the feast of the Epiphany, we recall that the Magi represent all the non-Jewish people who would eventually come and worship the one true God. Jesus responds to the request to meet with him in an unexpected way. Now that the Jewish people and gentiles have heard the Good News, he knows that he must prepare for the climax of his mission which is to die and rise again. Even though he is a Divine Person, Jesus struggles with the knowledge that he will soon face death. He himself does not hide the fact "troubled" that he is (Jn 12:27).

The author of the Letter to the Hebrews from today's Second Reading reminds the newly formed Christian community that "in the days when Christ Jesus was in the flesh, he offered prayers and supplications with loud cries and tears to the one who was able to save him from death and he was heard because of his reverence." (Hb 5: 7-8). The Lord went so far as to sweat blood during his agony in the garden (cf. Lk 22:44). This is a medical condition called hematohidrosis. It only occurs under soul crushing stress. This is what Jesus went through when facing the fact that he was about to be beaten, scourged and crucified. Despite all of this, Jesus remains firmly committed to his mission. Despite the devil's attempt to get him to abandon his mission, Jesus keeps his face firmly pointed towards Jerusalem. He does this because he loves the Heavenly Father, and he loves each one of us as he loves himself. How can we not be moved by this knowledge?

Beloved brothers and sisters, many of us often wrongly believe that courageous people do not experience fear. Not true! Jesus himself experienced a great deal of it as revealed by Sacred Scripture. True courage is a gift of the Holy Spirit who helps us confront our fears and work through them without backing away from doing what we know to be true. St Joan of Arc is a good example. She desired to serve the Lord in her life and suffered much as a consequence for her fidelity to him. Although completely innocent, she was burned at the stake due to the jealousy of a handful of wicked clergy. She herself cried out and begged for mercy as she was being dragged to the stake. Even though she died a horrible death, the Church now recognizes her to be a great saint. May she intercede for all of us who are facing painful trials and tempted to give up.
