

The Pastor's Reflection

"Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Blessed is the kingdom of our father David that is to come! Hosanna in the highest!" (Mk

11:9-10)

Brothers and sisters in Christ:

According to Fr. Weinandy OFM, Cap, Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem fulfills multiple Old Testament prophecies (Jesus Becoming Jesus, 2018). First, Jesus inherits the everlasting throne of his father in spirit, King David. Jesus Christ is the eternal King whose throne will endure forever. Second, Jesus is the Spirit-anointed Suffering Servant whose sacrifice will "grant us access to the Father" (Is 50:4-7). This is anticipated by his act of entering Jerusalem on a "humble ass". It foreshadows his humiliating passion and death by crucifixion. Third, the profound rejoicing of the crowds fulfills prophecies of both Isaiah (62:10-12) and Zechariah (9:9-10). Jesus Christ will be the King who brings true peace to the ends of the earth.

The Passion Narrative of Our Lord Jesus Christ According to Mark will be proclaimed this Sunday. We recall the Last Supper, Passion and Death of Our Lord with profound sadness and deep gratitude. The Innocent One is betrayed by those whom he loves so tenderly. Who is not moved by such a scene? He is abandoned by everyone at the hour of his greatest need. At best, they follow him from a distance (c.f. Mk 15:54). Fear got the best of them and prevented them from drawing close to him. Yet, throughout this ordeal, Jesus accepts the mission entrusted to him by the Father. Unlike all the others who were crucified before him, his death was different. Even the centurion, "who stood facing him...said..."truly this man was the Son of God!" (Mk 15:39).

My brothers and sisters, all of us will one day have to face death. Both believers and non-believers share this truth in common. However, we Christians have the certainty of knowing that we will not be alone. Jesus Christ, who has gone before us, will give us everything we will need to peacefully pass from this life to the next. Moreover, we have the certainty that it will not end in the grave but in the arms of the Heavenly Father thanks to his Son. For this reason, we not only lay down our palms, but also our own lives, before him.
