

The Pastor's Reflection

"Destroy this temple and in three days I will raise it up." (Jn 2:19)

Dear brothers and sisters in the Lord:

This Sunday's Gospel is focused on the dramatic scene of Jesus' cleansing of the Temple. His Father's House has been turned into a "marketplace" (Jn 2:16). At first, this seems rather perplexing. Was it not the Lord himself who commanded the offering of animal sacrifice in the Temple? The Jewish people had to buy the animals of sacrifice from somewhere. Some Jews traveled a very long distance to worship in the Temple for Passover. They would have had different currency that required them to exchange it. So why would Jesus get so angry?

Some commentators wrongly suggest that the intermingling between religion and money is what ultimately triggered the Lord's righteous anger. But is that really true? We have several letters written by St Paul in the New Testament dedicated to the taking up of monetary collections for the Church in Jerusalem (cf. 1 Cor 16:1-4 and 2 Cor:1-9:15). It seems more likely that Jesus was angry over the fact that they had lost sight of the reason for the sacrifice and turned their hearts towards their own material gain. They went from worshipping God to worshipping "mammon" (Mt 6:24). In other words, they were explicitly violating God's commandment to "not have other gods before" him (Ex 20:2).

Brothers and sisters, it is so easy to turn money into an idol. Money is necessary, but it can provide us with a false sense of security and entitlement. Everything comes from God and belongs to him too. On Ash Wednesday, Jesus told us to "give alms" (Mt 6:2). This is an important part of our Lenten practices. Why? Because our level of generosity towards the Church and the poor is commensurate with our level of trust in God's providence. Clinging to material possessions is a form of idolatry we must be reject. We will not be able to experience the freedom that comes from being a disciple of "Christ crucified" until we learn to let go and become more generous with God (1 Cor 1:22). All our material possessions, ourselves included, will eventually turn back to "dust". All that will remain will be the love we had for God in this life and our good works that were inspired by it. May they be many!
