

### The Pastor's Reflection

The Lord addressed Job out of the storm and said: "Who shut within the doors the sea...?" (Jb 38:1)

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

One of the greatest stumbling blocks to belief in God relates to the problem of suffering. In today's First Reading, Job has reached the end of his rope. He knows that he does not deserve to suffer because he has done nothing wrong. Back then, and still today, many people think that all their suffering is sent to them as a punishment for their sins. God responds to Job by asking him a series of questions. Where were you when I created the sea? In other words, God reminds Job that he did not consult with human beings when He decided to create the universe. Job places his hand over his mouth and then realizes that there are reasons why things happen in this life that God allows for his own purposes.

This may seem like a very small consolation. However, in his mercy, the Lord does finally give an answer to the problem of innocent suffering. This happens when Jesus Christ mounts the wood of the cross on Good Friday. Who is more innocent than God himself? Jesus shows us that no-one remains untouched by evil. He who is without sin is treated worse than the basest of criminals.

What are we to do? Years ago, during a Young Adults Conference in Steubenville, OH, a Franciscan Friar of the Renewal gave a great answer to the question of innocent suffering. He said that we should not ask God why, but we should ask what does this mean?

I urge you to do the same. Lord, what do you want me to learn from this experience? One thing is for sure, that our suffering will not separate us from him. In fact, it can draw us closer into his Sacred Heart. During this month of June, I encourage you to rediscover the powerful devotion to the Sacred Heart of Our Lord Jesus Christ. There you will find consolation, strength and hope for the future, when every tear will be wiped away and every sorrow will turn into pure joy for those who remain faithful to the end.


