

The Pastor's Reflection

"I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats this bread will live forever, and the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh."

(Jn 6:50-1)

My brothers and sisters in the Lord:

We know when God has something of immense importance to reveal to us, he does it slowly. The seeds which were planted in the Old Testament, only grow to maturity in the New Testament. This is especially true in the case of the Holy Eucharist.

In the first reading from the Book of Kings (1 Kgs 19:4-8), we hear about the prophet Elijah. He has just defeated the false prophets of Baal, a demon who was worshipped as a god. Elijah was ecstatic for revealing that only Yahweh is the true God. However, the euphoria disappeared quickly when the evil Jezebel sought to kill him out of revenge. Now, this powerful prophet is afraid for his own life. He is exhausted from his journey. He falls down to the ground. and begins to complain to God. In the midst of his lament, he hears God speak to him. The Lord says "Get up and eat!" He is given water and bread baked on hot stones. This bread provides him with strength for his challenging journey.

Today's Gospel picks up on this theme of bread. Jesus recalls an episode of salvation history where the Israelites were left starving in the desert. God provides them with bread or 'manna' and water from the rock. Again, God provides physical food for their journey to the promised land. Jesus uses this as a teaching moment to reveal his doctrine on the Holy Eucharist. He tells the Jews that his flesh is "for the life of the world." (Jn 6:51) In other words, Jesus reveals that he will give his literal self to his disciples through the Eucharist. He doesn't give us a symbol. He gives us his actual self. For those who have studied Eucharistic miracles, they know well that it is Christ's living flesh.

Why does Jesus give himself to us in the Eucharist? He promised to be with us until the end of the ages (Mt 28:20). He knows that we are body/soul composites and are unable to survive on physical sustenance alone. Our souls need spiritual food. It is the reason that Jesus gives himself to us under the veil of bread.

We are blessed to receive the Divine Saviour, and to sit before him in quiet adoration and conversation. Pope Francis has always been a big supporter of Eucharistic Adoration. His Holiness assures us "It's a beautiful moment to be before the Lord when we can pour out our hearts to Him-He who loves us and wants to know everything that's going on inside our hearts." We all have Elijah moments when we might be tired and afraid. We might be angry or confused or even very sad. The Lord is always waiting for us in the tabernacle to console us with his Divine Presence.

Let us ask the Lord for the grace to grow in our understanding and desire for the Eucharist for ourselves and for all Christians. May Jesus grant us the spiritual strength to persevere on our journey towards our final destination, heaven.
