

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The Pastor's Reflection

"...put away the old self of your former way of life, corrupted by deceitful desires, and be renewed in the spirit of your minds, and put on the new

self..." (Eph 4:22-23)

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

When we were baptized, the following words were spoken to us: "...you have become a new creation, and have clothed yourself in Christ. See in this white garment the outward sign of your Christian dignity. With your family and friends to help you by word and example, bring that dignity unstained into the everlasting life of heaven."

After baptism, each Catholic is called to inform one's beliefs and decisions based on divine revelation and authentic Church teaching as presented in the Bible, the Catechism of the Catholic Church, and ongoing Magisterial texts. Why? Because Jesus is "the way, the truth and the life." (Jn 14:6) Jesus reveals what actually IS, unlike the secular world which is full of opinions. God is incapable of being deceived or of deceiving. His desire is for us to flourish in this life, and to be saved in eternity. Many Catholics refuse to listen to the Lord and his Church; they claim that it is important to be open-minded and prefer to fit in and be accepted into the rest of society. As the great G. K. Chesterton used to say, "be careful about being too open-minded lest your brain fall out!" I would add, and your heart too!

In today's Second Reading, St Paul is encouraging Christians in Ephesus to stop living like they did before their baptism. He tells them to stop being futile in their thinking. What exactly does this mean? To begin, futile is an adjective which means "incapable of producing a result or pointless" (MW, 2005). The Gentiles way of thinking was futile as they lacked a true understanding of the truth of Christ. Their beliefs were shaped by the different pagan cultures in which they lived. Rather than follow God's commandments, as transmitted to them through Moses, they began to think like those who did not know the truth. Thinking precedes acting. Consequently, they began to worship a golden calf. They demanded a human king rather than God himself. They even went so far as to sacrifice their own children to false gods!

If we want to live in peace, we need to change our thinking. We need to discern every relationship, every investment, even every political vote according to the truth revealed in the Gospel of Jesus Christ. As we flourish in the truth of Christ, so will many others.

Mysteries of the Rosary | Paradisus Dei


The Mysteries of the Rosary is a four-part film series hosted by Mark Hartfiel, Vice President of Paradisus Dei and current developer of
