

The Pastor's Reflection

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

This Sunday, God's Word encourages us to reflect upon the

true meaning and purpose of religion. A few months ago, the famous atheist Richard Dawkins, who turned agnostic, publicly revealed that he now professes to be a "cultural Christian". What exactly does a "cultural Christian" mean? According to Dawkins, he loves to listen to Christmas music, to see the decorations and to eat the good foods associated with the joyful season. However, Dawkins fails to believe that the reason for the seasons we celebrate are actually true. This is a huge problem. What is the point of celebrating the birth of Christ if we do not believe that he exists? What is the point of celebrating Easter if we do not accept that Christ died for our sins and was risen from the dead?

We know with certainty that God did become man, died and rose from the dead. The Second Person of the Trinity, our Lord Jesus Christ, took on flesh to save us and to show us how to live in a way that pleases the Heavenly Father. Yes, the decorations are beautiful, and the fancy foods are good. However, true religion is about having a pure heart that seeks to know and live the will of God, and to help and protect those who are most likely to be exploited by evil-hearted men and women.

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us that evil intentions come from within and not from without (cf. Mk 7:21-23). People whose hearts are consumed with "fornication, theft, murder, deceit, licentiousness, envy, slander, pride, folly" (Mk 7:22) are often those who exploit the most vulnerable members of our community. The West became "a great nation" when we followed the commands and the precepts of the Lord God our God (cf. Dt 4:6). Today, we risk losing everything if we continue to reject God's commandments in favour of following the corrupt desires of impure people who have no love for God and humanity.

Let us ask the Lord to grant us purity of heart, to will and do the will of God, so that we can live our Catholic faith in a way that will please the Blessed Trinity and continue to draw God's graces upon us and our world.


