"Love your enemies..." (Lk 6:27)

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

What is the hardest thing for many of us

to do? Love our enemies. Pure and simple. Most of us will get by ignoring them, or at best tolerating their presence. Yet, Jesus asks us to love them. It's no wonder that these words are amongst the hard sayings of our Lord Jesus Christ.

We all love to hear about how much God loves us, however, it's not so easy to hear that we must actively will the good of the one who has really hurt us. The spouse who betrayed their marriage vows, the religious who caused a deep scandal in the church, the lying politician who clings to power for their own sake rather than to use it for the common good, the friend who told others what was said in secret, the thief who stole from us, etc. All these examples were taken from a quick scroll through social media posts!

They are also being quickly forgotten by many Catholics. It's shocking to hear how some of us talk about people, even those who hate the Church. It is good and just to want to defend our Mother the Church, but without the same hateful rhetoric of those who hate us. Revenge might feel good for a fleeting moment, but the guilt from having reacted like a pagan rather than a Christian will eventually sting our conscience.

One woman who understood what it meant to "love one's enemies" was St. Joan Valois. She was married to a man for political reasons, rather than love, as was common back in 15th-century France. She loved her husband, but he treated her terribly. He left her due to her physical disabilities and married another woman to secure his wealth. To make matters worse, he would publicly embarrass St. Joan. Remarkably, she was always charitable. St. Joan tried to defend herself publicly but never sunk to his despicable level. Moreover, St. Joan would become a nun and establish her own religious congregation.

When she was praying, St. Joan heard the Blessed Virgin Mary speak the following words to her:

"You shall seek to establish peace among all those among whom you dwell. You shall speak nothing but words of peace, concerned for the salvation of souls. You shall not listen to slanderous words, and as soon as you see some sinners, you shall say in your heart: these poor people must be saved. For God has allowed them to sin in your presence to see, He, God, how you would pray for them and what labor you would undertake to save them. Excuse them before God in order to be, as I told you, the advocate and defender of all." (taken from The Pillar, Feb 4, 2025) Love your enemies. So simple, yet so hard to do if we try it alone. St. Joan and all holy men and women who are able to will the God of those who hate them cannot happen unless we cling to Christ through prayer and hide within the Sacred Heart which aches over this world.


