"Of you my heart has spoken: Seek his face. It is your face, O Lord, that I seek; hide not your face from me." (Cf Psalm 26.8-9)

From the Pastor

"But our citizenship is in heaven, and it is from there that we are expecting a Saviour, the Lord Jesus Christ. He will transform the body of our humiliation that it may be conformed to the body of his

glory, by the power that also enables him to make all things subject to himself." (Phil 3:20-1)

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

On this Second Sunday of Lent, the Church presents us with the Transfiguration of Jesus Christ. It is a deeply moving scene for the three privileged disciples to witness. The event is so remarkable that even St. Peter is at a loss for words! For a moment, Jesus's divine nature shines through his humanity. Jesus is "light from light" and radiates this divine light from within himself. It is unlike the light which shines upon us from the sun.

The Heavenly Father tells us to listen to his Son (cf. Lk 9:35). Listening is an essential part of our Lenten journey. We give up social media, television, and the radio so that we can have less noise to distract us from what our Lord wants to say. And what does Jesus have to say? Prepare yourselves for heaven (cf. Phil 3:20). We were made for heaven. We were made to live in glorified bodies too. We are not meant to remain without physical bodies for all eternity. Under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, St. Paul tells us to look forward with hope to the day in which we too will be transfigured through Christ's own divine power.

The transfiguration gives us a glimpse of what will happen to us in the future. It only happens when we pray for and cooperate with God's grace. As Blessed Marmion, the famous Benedictine Abbot, taught, "all our sanctity consists in becoming by grace what Jesus Christ is by nature, the child of God." (Koenemann, 2024)

The best way to prepare for the transformation is to avoid everything that poisons our souls, in other words, sin. We should avoid sin as it is the junk food of our souls, in the same way we avoid junk food because of its detrimental effects on our bodies.

As part of our Lenten journey, please avail yourselves to the Sacrament of Confession. It will heal and restore and strengthen us all as we await the new heavens and new earth.


