THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT

"My eyes are always on the Lord, for he rescues my feet from the snare. Turn to me and have mercy on me, for I am alone and poor." (Cf Psalm 24. 15-16)



"A woman of Samaria came to draw water. Jesus said to her, "Give me a drink." His disciples had gone into the town to buy food. The Samaritan woman said to him, "How can you, a Jew, ask me, a Samaritan woman, for a drink?" For Jews use nothing in common with

Samaritans. Jesus answered and said to her, "If you knew the gift of God and who is saying to you, "Give me a drink," you would have asked him and he would have given you living water." (Jn 4: 7-10)

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

On this Third Sunday of Lent, the Church presents us with the encounter between Jesus and the Samaritan woman. Historically, the Jews and Samaritans despised each other. The story is long and complicated and makes today's Gospel reading so intriguing. John tells us it was "about noon." (Jn 4:6) Why is this time so significant? Normally, women would go to the well together, to extract water for their families, and to gossip. It was a regular part of their daily life. No one went to the well at noon because the sun would be at its peak making it very hot. This Samaritan woman was not exactly a beacon of moral purity. It is likely that she went to the well at that time to avoid the wagging tongues of her compatriots. To her surprise, a Jewish man is sitting by the well, and to her utter shock, he speaks to her! Her supposed archenemy.

Jesus asks her for a drink of water. She responds as expected. What is most surprising is that Jesus' request is not for liquid H20. He wants something else from her. Jesus wants the Samaritan woman to have faith in him. Only he knew what was going on in her heart. After all, he is God.

Like Nicodemus when he thought he had to be physically reborn, rather than spiritually reborn, she too keeps thinking in earthly terms. Jesus is telling her that he wants to provide her with the Holy Spirit, who is the Living Water. It is Jesus who gives us divine life. Her faith in Christ begins to grow after he reveals her lived situation. This woman is in a sinful relationship. She comes to believe that Jesus is a prophet because he was able to tell her about her past and present without ever having met her before their encounter at the well.

The Samaritan woman departs to tell others what just happened. She overcomes her public shame and tells others that the Messiah has arrived. John makes it clear that many believed because of her testimony (Jn 4:39). Her courage to

share her testimony led others to Jesus, who in turn, encountered him, and eventually came to believe in him.

Brothers and sisters, many of us have gone through life drinking from many different wells. However, we were always left thirsty. It was the encounter with Jesus Christ that finally gave us true refreshment. Let us follow the example of the Samaritan woman by sharing our testimonies with others so that they too can come to the Lord Jesus Christ and experience the power of his love.


