"Then, I, John, saw a new heaven and a new earth; for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and the sea was no more. And I saw the holy city, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as

a bride adorned for her husband." (Rev 21: 1-2)

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

During the days leading up to the conclave, many secular people had much to say about the Catholic Church. So much so, that more Catholics actually believed and uncritically accepted what was told them about the Church.

One of the biggest misunderstandings made by the secular and many people of faith is to consider the Church to be an institution. From the outside, it looks like a massive human institution that is filled with all types of issues. Many will say that the Church seems outdated and in need of updating so as to be acceptable to the world.

While the Church does have an organizational aspect to it, we must remember that she is first and foremost the Bride of Christ and Mother of Christians. "The Church is a bride because Jesus is a bridegroom. Jesus referred to Himself as the Bridegroom (cf. Mt 9:15; Mk 2:19-20, Lk 5:34-35) and the Church is the bride, as described in the Book of Revelation (21:2). Furthermore, the Church is a Mother: our souls are born in her, and this motherhood flows forth from her role as the Bride of Christ." (Get Fed, 2023). Moreover, the Church is holy, as the Holy Spirit animates her.

"We also know that there are many people who are attracted to the Catholic Church but are understandably reluctant to approach her due to misunderstandings, or, as a result of the disgraceful behaviour of some of her members. Benedict XVI addressed this issue during his visit to the USA, 2009. In his homily at St Patrick's Cathedral, Benedict said that the Church building itself may look grey and drab on the exterior. However, if we surrender our fear or concerns to God and are willing to cross the threshold, we will come to discover her inner beauty." (Turrone, 2024 Easter Vigil Homily)


