SAINTS PETER & PAUL

"These are the ones who, living in the flesh, planted the Church with their blood; they drank the chalice of the Lord and became the friends of God."



"I believe in God, the Father almighty, the Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord."

During the tumultuous year of 1968, the world and the Church were experiencing profound upheaval. St. Paul

VI wrote a long and always relevant Apostolic Letter addressed to all members of the Church. This long-forgotten Letter is entitled Solemni Hac Liturgia, Credo of the People of God, where the Holy Father reflects on the meaning of the martyrdom of St Peter and St Paul.

St. Paul VI wrote, "On...this feast of the blessed apostles Peter and Paul, we have wished to offer to the living God the homage of a profession of faith. And as once at Caesarea Philippi the apostle Peter spoke on behalf of the twelve to make a true confession, beyond human opinions, of Christ as Son of the living God, so today his humble successor, pastor of the Universal Church, raises his voice to give, on behalf of all the People of God, a firm witness to the divine Truth entrusted to the Church to be announced to all nations."

St Peter's profession of faith is also our profession of faith. Today, our world is going through a great cultural upheaval in a way that could not have been anticipated back in the 60's. The advent of Artificial Intelligence (Pope Leo XVI), a "piece-meal" war (Pope Francis), and the spread of the culture of death (St. John Paul II) have left many people, including members of the household of faith, weak and disoriented (Benedict XVI).

We remember that Truth is found in a Person, Jesus Christ. Like St Peter and St Paul, we are called to profess with our lips and lives the one universal saviour of humankind. The bark of Peter will always experience various storms, but it is our faith in God which provides unwavering trust in His goodness and love for each one of us.

Before his martyrdom, St Paul wrote to his spiritual son, Timothy. "Beloved: I am already being poured out as a libation, and the time of my departure has come. I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith." (2 Tim 4:6) It is without a doubt that these words are equally applied to St Peter. Even though they both died at separate times, they died for one reason: Jesus Christ.

May their example of shared faith nourish and encourage our faith journey, too.
