

## Weekly Biblical Reflection

"He...saw Abraham far away with Lazarus by his side."

"There was a rich man who was dressed in fine linens who feasted sumptuously every day. And at his gate lay a poor man covered with sores, who longed to satisfy his hunger with what fell from the rich man's table."

#### Dear friends in Christ:

As deacons, we are called to a ministry outside of the church. My ministry is an organization called Dismas, named after St. Dismas, the good thief. As you can probably surmise, I work with prisoners and former prisoners through fellowship, sharing a meal, or just helping them get back on track.

Today's readings reminded me of the people I work with, because it is all about indifference. We have a tendency to be blind to what is going on around us. All Lazarus longed for was some table scraps that may have fallen on the floor, yet this rich man appears not to even see him lying there.

It would have been so easy for him to just toss a piece of bread or some other small morsel, yet he chooses not to. How often do we find ourselves in this same predicament? How often are we walking down the street and see someone sleeping on a grate, trying to stay warm, or with a hand out looking for something to eat? More often than what we may even notice.

All Jesus ever asked of us was to be like Him, Christ-like. Feed the hungry, clothe the naked, visit the infirmed and imprisoned. All Jesus ever wanted was for us to live a life caring for others, using His own life as an example for all of us to follow. Are we actually doing that, or are we indifferent?

When we walk by a puppy or kitten shivering in the cold, hungry, and wet, most people stop and help. Yet when we walk by our fellow man in the same circumstances, we do not always see them, even being there.

Today, we see the results of being indifferent. The rich man is begging Abraham, but it is too late. You had your chance. You had your whole life to help someone like Lazarus, yet you chose not to. So, in essence, yes, sometimes it is too late.

Therefore, next time you see someone, maybe hand them a bottle of water, buy them a sandwich, or give them a warm blanket. Maybe this winter, volunteer for the Out of the Cold program we run in our church hall. On the other hand,

maybe you can do the most difficult thing possible: smile, say hello, and just ask, "How are you?" striking up a conversation with a total stranger who may be down on their luck. It doesn't need to be difficult or intrusive.

All God ever asked us was to do good, so "Do Good"


