

"To you, I lift up my soul, O my God. In you, I have trusted; let me not be put to shame, Nor let my enemies exult over me; and let none who hope in you be put to shame." (Cf. Psalm 24. 1-3)

Weekly Biblical Reflection

"As the days of Noah were, so will be the coming of the Son of Man."

Happy New Year! Today, we start a new liturgical year, and with that, a new spiritual journey. Advent always greets us quietly, almost gently, but with a message that is anything but soft: "Stay awake. Be ready. The Lord is coming."

By Jesus giving us this invitation, He isn't trying to startle or frighten us. He is inviting us to live awake, to live aware of His presence coming into our lives every single day. Advent is not only about preparing for the birth of Jesus two thousand years ago; it's about recognizing how He comes to us now, in the ordinariness of our days, and how He will come again in glory.

Therefore, what we really should be asking is: What does readiness look like?

It has nothing to do with fear, frantic activity or even spiritual perfectionism. Jesus tells us what readiness looks like. It is living with intention, with a heart that listens, with a faith that chooses love, especially when it's inconvenient or may even cost us something.

Like New Year's, when we reflect on the past year and make resolutions for the new year, Advent asks us to do the same thing. What attitudes, habits, or resentments need to be retooled into something new, something that gives life or adds to my life rather than draining it?

We do this not because we are bad or failing, but because God has something better for us, something deeper, richer, more alive. Advent is our annual reminder that our spiritual life should never be stagnant, because God is always drawing us forward.

So as we light the first candle on the Advent wreath, let it be more than a ceremony. Let it be a commitment. A small flame that represents our desire to walk in the light of Christ.

This week, I encourage you to do one simple thing. Find one moment each day to pause, breathe, and say, "Come, Lord Jesus."

Say it in the car, while doing chores, when you are anxious or rushed. Every time you do, you are choosing to live awake by opening a door for Christ.

May this Advent be a time of renewal, softening, and awakening, so that when the Lord does come, in

whatever way He chooses, He finds our hearts open, our hands ready, and our lives shining with His light.

Amen.


